This is by far not the only youth program sponsored by the Ames Legion family. You will see on the calendar that our air rifle club meets




each Sunday at the Izaak Walton League from 1-3. SAL member Cort

The Post and Unit are accepting applications for **Girls*** Boys and Girls State. These pro-


grams are held in June and use the city, county and state governments in Iowa to create a model government populated by students that finished their junior year in high school in 2022.
