Red Lines Go Up




Membership continues to go up with the Unit jumping into the lead.

Academic Awards Set New Record



A new record for Academic awards was set at Ames High School on November 29. That evening 499 Academic Letters were presented to Ames High students.

That increase came about due to extension of the eligibility to members of the sophomore class. Previously only juniors and seniors had been eligible.

Beginning with this year, one other change was made. Previously the students to be recognized needed a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.5 or above. Starting this year, it is required that the student carry a GPA of 3.5 through the previous year. That requires that students not coast and allow their GPA to drop as graduation gets closer.

Along with the change in requirements,

it was necessary to more the awards convocation into the gymnasium to be able to accommodate the crowd. The sophomores were especially excited since they were the first sophomore class to be included. We were happy to see as many parents, family members and friends as we did students.
