
The membership work of the Legion family continues with the Unit beginning to stretch out their lead.

There will be EIGHT winners drawn from among those whose membership is current. If any of those eight are from the Sixth District, there will be an additional \$250 added to the prize.

For all of the Legionnaires that have renewed or joined for 2023, you have contributed to helping lowa be in the top 10 in the membership chart in the country.



On December 14, the Iowa American Legion was in 3rd place nationally. That was the 75% target date with lowa being nearly 80%. Thanks to all those who have a 2023 Legion card.

Post Commander Jay Was Called Away—Editor's Comments

The Iowa American Legion family will gather at the Iowa Capitol on January 18 for our annual Veterans Day on the Hill. We will gather at HQ for a briefing and move to the capitol for comments by the Governor and legislative leaders. Following that, Legion family members will meet individually with their Senators and Representatives.

We will address five issues with our legislators. They are:

Increase in the Veterans Property Tax Exemption—The Veterans Property Tax has existed since 1886 with the last increase enacted in 1974 when the exemption was increased from \$500 to \$1.852.

Funding for the Military Homeownership Assistance Program-This program provides funds for recruiting out of state veterans by assisting with one-



time housing purchase. It typically runs out of money in the first few months each year with applicants placed on a waiting list. The program should have enough money to be available all year.

Increase Spendable Amount Annual-

ly from the Veterans Trust Fund— The Iowa Commission of Veterans Affairs is currently too restricted in the amount that can be spent each year from the Veterans Trust Fund. An increase would allow better use of the Trust Fund.

Increase Appropriation to the County Commission of Veterans Affairs Fund— The appropriation amount used by the county commissions for national training and related expenses for county veteran service officers and appropriate staff should be increased.

Approve Legislation for Veterans Treatment Courts-Veterans Treatment Courts provide a treatment court model designed specifically for justices-involved veterans that will maximize efficiency and economize resources.
