## Your Legion Dues Provide Help With Benefits

We all know that dues for the Ames American Legion Post will increase by \$10 on January 1. I suspect that there are those who are asking themselves, "Is it worth that extra \$10? Where does that go?"

Let's talk about that. There are benefits that come from your dues that you may not see. Benefits from work that happens in Des Moines and Washington DC.

Those benefits happen because The American Legion employs the professionals needed to form relationships with our legislators and those that assist our comrades with VA claims.

Only one of these benefits comes directly to you from their work. This year veterans that own their home will see the property tax exemption go from \$1,852 to \$4,000. A big part of the credit for getting that increase passed goes to the advocacy firm that the lowa

American Legion employs to help with legislation. Your dues help with that.

In Des Moines, your dues also pay part of the salary for our service officers as they work to help veterans with VA claims. Is that help needed by those veterans and is it well spent?

A simple look at the report from the Des Moines Regional Office answers that question. Their 2023 fiscal year report showed that \$1,585,364 came to those veterans that had Legion representation. That same report shows that all the VSOs that assisted with claims totaled \$2,561,773.

In other words, almost 2/3 of the claims granted came because of Legion representation. Your dues helped with each of those claims by paying the salaries of those Legion representatives.

In Washington, we recently saw the passage of the PACT Act for those veterans that served in Iraq and Afghanistan. That legislation does for them what the Agent Orange legislation did for the Vietnam veteran, establishes service connection for certain conditions traced back to the chemical exposure they suffered during their service.

Your dues help pay for the professional staff that work for the Legion to help with legislation. You are partially responsible for the compensation those Iraq and Afghanistan veterans will receive.

Is it worth the extra \$10? It is worth much more than that. We were formed to help our comrades. Without members we can't do that. We need you to help us help them. Renew NOW.

This month is where your Riders step up to complete our yearly mission. On December 16th, at 11am, your riders will stand in front of our community and celebrate the lives our our Veterans that are no longer with us. At Ames Cemetery, and this year Ontario Cemetery, your Riders will place approximately 1800 wreaths on the grave of Veterans. This mission started in 2020, with just the ceremony and the wreaths for the branches of the military.

Since that cold December day, we've audited the cemetery, worked with the city to improve their records, and brought the message of Wreaths Across America. That message is to Remember, Honor, and Teach. WAA puts it this way, "In many American homes, every day there is an empty seat for one who is serving or one who made the ultimate sacrifice for our country and never came home. That is why the Wreaths Across America mission to Remember, Honor and Teach lasts all year long, far beyond the single day in December when we coordinate wreath-laying ceremonies."

Your Riders are proud to be ambassadors in this mission. Of particular note is a quote from Pierre Claeyssens, a designer of the WWII Liberty ships. "To be killed in war is not the worst that can happen. To be lost is not the worst that can happen... to be forgotten is the worst." Each grave is presented a wreath and the presenter is asked to say the name of the individual out loud and thank them for their service.

We'd welcome your help. If you can spare an hour or so on the 16th, meet us at Ames Cemetery at 10:45. It's only with your help that this mission is fulfilled every year. If you would like more information, reach out to the WAA committee, and there is a volunteer sign up sheet at the post as well. To those of you that have supported us all year long with the can drives, donation of time, and by helping us reach out to sponsors, your Riders would like to say thank you.

Lastly, I would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas from your Riders, it's an honor to be part of the Ames Legion Family.

For those considering post High School education or training you can help them out. By telling them about the Sons of the American Legion Merit Award you can help them pay for their continuing education. The S.A.L. Merit Award is better this year. We are now awarding two (2) \$1000.00 awards.

The current High School senior is eligible; if they are a descendant of an Ames Legion Post 37 Member and the student can live anywhere, or if they are the descendant of a veteran that lives anywhere, and attend High School at Ames or Gilbert High Schools, or if they are Home Schooled but live in one of the two school districts.
