

As I write this, several of your Riders are packing and getting ready to meet up with over a dozen other Riders from lowa and ride to Independence, Missouri to start the Legacy Run. Several others are packing their bags, and our bags, and will meet us at National Convention in New Orleans. So, as I wind down my tenure of your Riders Director I want to look back on some of the things we've done over the years. Events like Wreath Day in December are new and exciting, and I love to see the same faces year after year braving the weather with us. One though, remains the most special. We just passed the 5 year anniversary of the most honorable ride that I've done. On August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019 your Ames Riders and Riders from all around the area gathered at the DSM airport to bring home one of our own. Cpl. Ralph Bennett was escorted home to his family and laid to rest in the long empty grave site after being an unidentified soldier and listed as missing in action since June 13, 1944. At the time that his remains were identified there were still over 72 thousand unaccounted for soldiers and sailors from WWII. It was there, in Ames Cemetery on a sunny August day that we stood a proud salute, and through our own misty eyes we watched a family find closure.

We enjoy what we do, don't get me wrong. But there are times where the enjoyment is tempered by a sense of duty, honor, and respect. Those times are the times that stick with me the most.
