

# JSSP Update from Coach Cort

Our JSSP club is in full swing, holding weekly practices on Sundays, 12:15pm to 3:00pm. 16 of 17 youth participants returned this year, with 8 new members added. The club is a beehive of activity. As I have mentioned previously, our club co-sponsor, Ames Izaak Walton League, gave us permission to hold practices in the upstairs main meeting room. This is a large room that doubles our capacity for firing stations. However, in order to take advantage of this new space, we needed to purchase additional equipment to "pellet proof" the room. The club secured funds from the Ames Post and Squadron, as well as private donations, to purchase a ballistic curtain backstop and materials to construct ten new target stands.

Many thanks to Randy Lien of Lien Woodworking for designing and leading the effort to assemble these stands. He donated his time and our cost was only materials. Thanks also to Legion Post member and JSSP coach John Baldwin for assisting Randy in the assembly process! The ballistic curtain was sourced from a shop in Williamsburg, lowa, allowing us to support an lowa business. Our club also will be purchasing 5 additional used air rifle and shooting mats from a sister club in Swisher, Iowa. These additional rifles are needed because of the clubs growth over the last couple of years. We don't mind visitors, so if anyone is curious about what the club does, feel free to stop out during our practices.
