Iowa House Approves DSO Grant

Early last week, the Iowa House of Representatives passed HF 1000 by an unanimous 92-0 vote.

That bill authorizes an appropriation of \$250,000 for matching grants for the Veterans Service Organi-

zations to expand the staff in their Department Service Offices. The bill will now go on to the Senate for consideration there.

This measure represents a very significant step forward for those veterans in lowa that have filled claims with the Veterans Administration for compensation for service-connected disabilities and pension for income related condi-

The Iowa American Legion has seen our Service Office staff drop from four claims representatives working on behalf of veterans from 4 to 3. We have also changed so that all the clerical work is now done by volunteers, saving those funds..

This bill represents the recognition of



the state legislature that the veterans service organizations are not just working for the veterans but for the state of Iowa and that the state should recognize and help fund that service.

The American Legion is the major provider of veterans claims service in Iowa. The monthly reports from the VA Regional Office show that we are responsible for more claims work and federal VA funds coming into the state than all the other organizations combined.

Now we need the Senate to pass this appropriation so that Governor Reynolds can sign it into law. That is where you come in. Contact your state Senator and ask that their vote by AYE.

Go to www.legis.iowa.gov/legislators/ senate to find the email address for your Senator. Ask for the YES vote. Remember the bill number may change, Just ask them to approve the matching grant funding for the Veterans Service Organizations.

Officer Nomination Time



May is the month when the selection of officers for the coming year begins. Each of the Legion family organizations will be selecting a nominating committee to begin that process.

Those nominating committees are not going to just sit back and wait for people to volunteer. Their job is to search out the people that will make good officers, people that bring ability and talent, people that will work to make the Ames Legion Family better.

They will come armed with a list of possible offices for you to consider. They will be able to tell you what taking one of those officers will mean to you in terms of time commitment and effort.
