

AMERICAN LEGION BASEBALL TURNS 100



This summer in Milbank SD, American Legion Baseball will celebrate the 100th Anniversary of its birth in the summer of 1925. That summer, Legionnaires in Milbank decided that the young men of the community needed an activity and formed a baseball team.

This year, teams from North Dakota, Minnesota and Nebraska will join with the Milbank team on July 11-13 for a tournament to celebrate formation of that first team and the growth that came from it.

To the left you see a special edition bookazine put together to celebrate that 100th anniversary. The central figure in the book is Bob Feller,

then known as "The Heater from Van Meter", Van Meter Iowa of course. The bookazine will be available through Emblem Sales for \$10.

IMPACT OF THE AMERICAN LEGION

Sometimes we wonder what effect The American Legion might be having outside of Ames. National is now publishing that information.

VA Benefits: \$21 Billion in disability benefits was gained by veterans in 2024 due to American Legion service officers.

VA Benefits: 54,105 veterans that received free representation and assistance in 2021-2024.

Youth Programs: 114,722 young people participated in American Legion programs in 2024.

Operation Comfort Warrior: \$3.2 million in grants has been disbursed since 2007 for comfort items for disabled military personnel.

Grassroots Advocacy; 786,654 contacts made to legislators to assist in passage of the Legion's priorities.

Blood Donations: 96,691 Units in 2024.

Temporary Financial Assistance: Over \$18 million in grants through 2024 to stabilize the homes of veterans with minor children.

National Emergency Fund: Over \$10.7 million in disaster aid.

That is the tip of tie iceburg over the 105 years of The American Legion. Be proud.

Iowa Legislature—Mixed Results

The Iowa American Legion submitted two proposals to the Iowa Legislature this year. Now that they have gone home for the rest of the year, we can report mixed results, won one and lost one.

On the winning side, we requested an increase in the funds allocated to the Military Homeownership Assistance Program to assist military members and veterans in purchasing a home.

That fund was running out of money each year in April. We requested an additional allocation of \$250,000 which was approved.

The other side of the ledger was not a victory. We requested an allocation for a matching grant to assist the veterans service organizations in expanding service office staff.

That request was approved unanimously in the House but ran into opposition in the Senate and was not included. We will return with that request next year and between now and then may ask you to help educate the Senators.

Medical Loan Closet Closing

After a review of the Post's Medical Loan Closet Program, the Post Executive Board has determined it is the best interest of the Post to close the Medical Loan Closet.

This decision was driven primarily by insurance liability and sanitary concerns, but also by the fact that most insurance coverage, including Medicare/ Medicaid, now covers these items and by a lack of storage space at the Post.

Effective June 1st, we will no longer accept used medical equipment/items and we will no longer issue any medical equipment. We will keep a couple of items on hand, such as a wheelchair and walker for use in the Post.
