Membership Year Begins—Why Do We Renew

The 2026 membership year is off to a good start. Adjutant Doug says that 154 of our members have renewed for 2026. That is 35% of our goal of 437. Great start now we have to keep it going.

Obviously those 154 renewed members know why they want to continue their membership in the Ames Post of The American Legion. Do the rest of us know why we might want to renew our membership for next year? Lets think about some reasons.

The first thing you might think of to cause you to renew is our post home. We have a great place at 225 Main Street for you to visit and enjoy time with your friends. The food is good and the bar is friendly but not rowdy although when the Cyclones are playing that might change a little. The article below also talks

about our policy of members and guests so you can be assured the patrons respect our post home.

Your second reason might be the programs that we sponsor. Right now we are making arrangements for our 39th year of cosponsoring the Academic Awards at Ames High to recognize student achievement.

We are active in the Wreaths Across America program in the Ames cemeteries each year. Also, Last year we performed military service funeral honors for about 25 veterans.

Fifteen young people participate in the Shooting Sports program to learn weapon safety, shooting accuracy and the discipline that goes along with shooting skill.

Along with our Post programs, your renewal helps with programs at the state level that helps lowa's vet-

erans as well as the rest of the state. Our lowa Service Office helps more veterans with claims to the VA than all the other organizations put together. Almost 75% of the claims filed come through the Legion office. That is a great reason to renew.

Our legislative team works at the State House each year to support veterans benefits. If you enjoyed the increase in the military exemption on your property taxes a few years ago, that was result of a lot of hard work by the Legion legislative team.

Don't just let that renewal notice lay on your desk. Think of all the reasons to renew, pick it up and either send your \$55 dues check to the Post at 225 Main or go online to Legion.org, click the red RENEW button and use your credit card.

We are seeing more activity in the clubroom, particularly with our members bringing their friends in to enjoy our atmosphere and friendly club.

Legion Riders

As this newsletter is being put together, Cliff Barker and Mike Deacon from our Riders chapter are en route to Tampa for the National Convention. They are riding on the Legion's Legacy Run with approximately 230 other Riders from around the country.

The Iowa Riders will be donating approximately \$20,000 raised on local Legacy Runs in the state. The Legacy Run is an opportunity for the Legion Riders to raise money for the Veterans and Childrens Fund (VCF).

The Veterans side of the Fund is used to provide training to the service officers who work tirelessly to assist veterans with their claims to the VA. Every dollar there helps not just one veteran but goes on to help many others through the career of that trained service officer. Here in lowa those trained service officers are responsible for almost 75% of the claims being submitted to the VA.

The Childrens side of the Fund is used to help the minor child of a servicemember or a Legionnaire whose family is suffering from unexpected financial hardships that threaten the stability of the home. The fund can be used to help with food, housing, utilities and other basic needs after an investigation by a Legion official.

The funds donated on the Run will be presented at the National Convention in Tampa on August 27.

The Legacy Run is only one of the things that the Legion Riders do. If you are a member of the Legion, Auxiliary or Sons and ride a motorcycle, think about joining the Chapter. It is always good to have friends to ride with.

Quilts of Valor Plans

The Ames Legion family is planning a Quilts of Valor presentation later this year. If you have a veteran in your family or a veteran friend that has not been honored with a quilt, here is your opportunity.

A Quilt of Valor® (QOV) is a quality, handmade quilt that is machine or hand quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The Quilt says unequivocally, "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation."
