Mortgage Loan Payments and Deferred Maintenance

Two things have happened in the last 30 days that affect the future of The American Legion Post and the Legion family home in Ames.

The first affects the loan payments that are currently being made from the remodeling a few years ago. That loan comes due on December 15 and must be either refinanced or paid off.

At the September Post meeting, word was received that an anonymous donor wished to make a payment against the loan principal equal to a month's loan payment of \$1,517. That would reduce the amount to be refinanced.

That donor requested that a challenge be given to the membership to match that amount. More on that later in this article.

Since then, a second anonymous donor has come forward with the same offer. That second donor wants to keep the match challenge in place so that if the challenge is met, payments totaling three monthly payments would be made against the principal.

Details on the challenge will be in the next issue but it has been decided that the challenge will run through November and end November 30.

Make your plans now to help meet that challenge. The challenge period starts October 1. Your donation can be whatever size you wish but we need the total donations from the challenge to match a month's payment.

Another issue has come up though too. We have received a notice from the City of Ames that work is needed on the front of our building.

There is a window that was boarded over some time ago, exactly how long is unsure. That plywood needs to be removed and the window restored in order to stay within the city code. You will see that happen in the next few weeks.

In addition there are several bricks in the front wall that appear to be loose. That may be a symptom of a larger problem. We will have a masonry contractor check that wall and at least ensure that we are not about to have bricks fall.

This brings up an even larger issue. For many years, we have not used our building to its best potential. You may see some conversation starting on the future of the home of The Ames Legion Family. Is this building on Main Street the best location for that home?

Obviously, we cannot just continue deferring needed maintenance. Equally we cannot continue leaving one -third of the building completely unused. We need to have that conversation and think about the future of The Ames Legion Family and the home of that family.

Service Office Grant

The Iowa House of Representatives in 2024 UNANIMOUSLY passed HF 1000. This legislation would create a \$250,000 matching grant that The American Legion and other VSOs could draw on to increase the level of service they provide to veterans with claims to the VA.

Now that legislation needs to come back in 2026 in the Senate. There was resistance in the Senate last year that prevented passage. Now it is our time to speak with our Senators and urge them to commit to passage this year.

Why is this grant needed? The drop in membership means less dues money is available to support the service office. At the same time, need for trained service officers is growing. It is time for the state to step up and help their citizens that have been injured in service.

Why should a Senator support this legislation? First, those veterans with service-connected disabilities need the compensation to live. Second, every dollar that comes into lowa helps the economic position of the state. The compensation is not taxable but once it is spent, that money is taxable.
