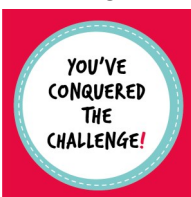

December 13, 2025—Ames Legion Family BIG WEEK

Everything you see on this page represents events that happened during the week surrounding December 13. It is referred to as the “BIG WEEK” since it required a maximum effort from the members of the Legion family. That maximum effort presented quite a challenge but that challenge was met and conquered.



That challenge graphic also has a specific meaning. In November the Post with the help of an anonymous donor kicked off a challenge to reduce the amount of the mortgage loan to be refinanced. With the help of our members, that challenge was not only met but was conquered. Rather than needing to refinance \$53,000, donation from our members and Legion family organizations reduced that amount to \$40,000.



Now we come to the events of December 13, biscuits and gravy breakfast by the Sons, cookie fair from the Auxiliary, Wreaths Across America under the leadership of the Riders and finally the Army-Navy watch party overseen by the Post.

The Sons served breakfast to 86 customers with the receipts going to general program support for the Squadron. Cookies—over 100 boxes of cookies were filled by cookie fairgoers with the proceeds from that event likewise going to program support for the Auxiliary.

From there, our Riders leadership left for the Ames Municipal Cemetery for the Wreaths Across America ceremony and wreath laying. They were prepared to hold the ceremony and because of the weather, postpone the wreath laying for a week. At the cemetery, though, they were met by 75-80 volunteers who braved that weather and placed those 1,900 wreaths on the graves of our veterans. Special mention goes to the Arnold Air Society cadets of the AFROTC unit at ISU. Not only did they place wreaths, but they uncovered the snow from many headstones so that the name could be read.

The Post finished the day by hosting a watch party for the Army-Navy game with pork loin by our volunteer chefs that was donated by the Deb and Jeff Hansen Foundation. That watch party saw 75-80 of our people come in to cheer on their favorite team and watch a great game.

Overall it was a great day to finish a great week. We saw first hand what the Legion family is capable of. It would not have been possible without the dozens of volunteers who donated funds, baked and donated cookies, came in early to cook breakfast, bundled up to place wreaths in a cold and snowy cemetery and cooked up some delicious pork loin.

Thanks especially to the Legion family leadership that took on these projects for BIG WEEK. They called and the volunteers stepped up. Put this week on your calendar for next year and be one of those volunteers or just enjoy one or more of the events.

Membership Builds Relationships and Aids Legislation



You may have seen this picture on your television on December 17. This meeting was during a press conference called by President Trump to announce his signing of an executive order reclassifying marijuana from a Schedule I drug to Schedule III. This action aligns with a policy that The American Legion adopted by resolution in 2016.

This reclassification declares that marijuana is medically useful in certain situations and allows research to begin to further define what those conditions are when marijuana could be prescribed. There is significant anecdotal evidence that marijuana can play a prominent role in the treatment of PTSD, TBI and certain other conditions arising from military service. Without this reclassification, though that would only be anecdotal not scientific evidence and VA doctors could not prescribe marijuana in those cases.

There is much significance here beyond just the ability of the VA to begin research and that the administration has accepted the position of The American Legion. Our National Commanders have met with Presidents many times in the past and stood alongside as the President took an action advocated by us. This picture though is different.

The action seen here is President Trump inviting Commander Wiley to comment during the press conference on the action being taken. Those of us with many years of Legion membership cannot remember a previous time when the President invited our National Commander to speak during a press conference. December 17 represents a step forward in the relationship between our leadership and the nation's leadership. This step forward does NOT represent The American Legion automatically agreeing with the position of the administration. We have in the past and no doubt will in the future disagree with the administration and will say so. What this does mean is that the Trump administration recognizes that we advocate based on positions and that our membership is steadfast. Once we take a position, we continue to maintain our membership and support that position.



Why is that important to us here in Iowa other than recognizing the respect we have in DC. We have a situation coming in the Iowa Legislature next month where we need to continue to tell a similar story.

The American Legion has spent the last 100 years advocating for our veterans with the VA, helping them receive the service-connected compensation they have earned but also helping them and their widows and orphans receive the pension funds that are set through legislation. That work requires professional claims representatives on our part to assist with developing those claims. Now we need help.

HF1000 passed the House last year authorizing a \$250,000 matching grant to the VSOs to make sure professional claims representatives are available. Unless the Senate passes that bill in 2026, that measure and the funding dies. We need our membership to stand steadfast and encourage their Senators to ignore other ideological issues that may divide the Senate and stand together in favor of HF1000 passing so that we can provide that help. Join us on January 21 at 9AM at HQ, 720 Lyon in Des Moines for a briefing.
